SEVEN MEN CHOSEN TO BE PINK TIE GUYS ARE ANNOUNCED AT FUNDRAISER GALA.

On Mother's Day eve, Joey Hinojosa of Irvine was dressed in a black tux and a pink tie with his mother, Rosa Schulz, at his side. Both were attending the Pink Tie Ball for the first time (Hinojosa's gift to Schulz), where rose-tinged cocktails and mini crab cakes were being served.

Hinojosa was one of seven men chosen this year to be Pink Tie Guys.
